Following are personal histories of the Herigstad/Kaiser children. Written and printed in 1991.

Five of us were born in Eastern Montana during the depression years. We were raised during the times when it was hard to make a living. Our mothers' heritage was Norwegian. Her father came from Norway as did her mother Pauling Musland. They married and homesteaded in the Midway district a few miles from Savage, Montana. Neither of our parents went to school beyond the 8th grade. They married June 16, 1925 in Savage. They lived there about 11 years before moving west in June of 1936.

Dads' father, Charles was born in Austria/Hungary in 1864 and his mother Victoria Westerstrum came from Sweden. She was born in 1869. They both came into the country through Ellis Island.

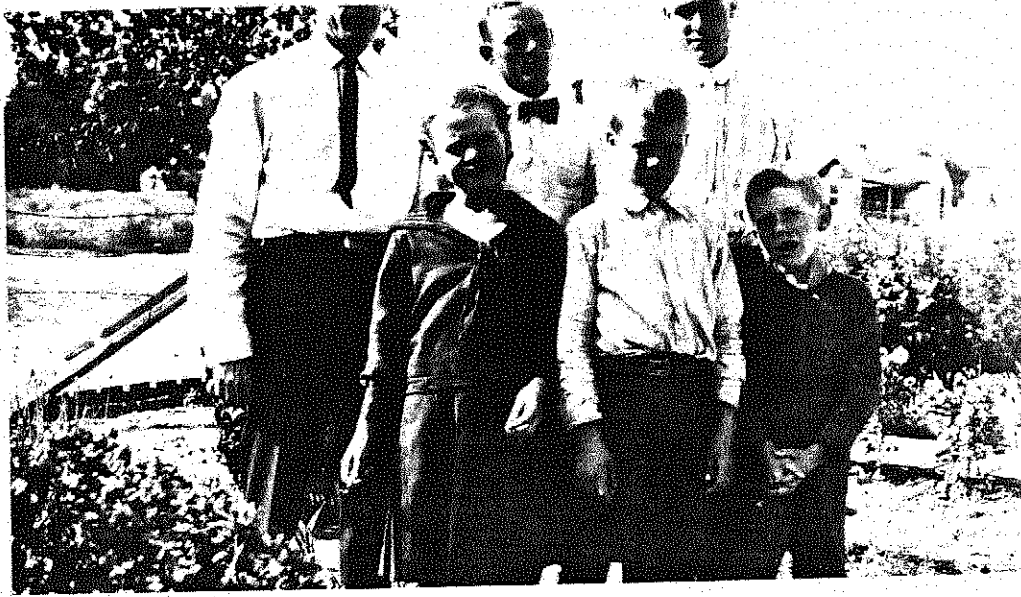

Grandpa Kaiser, Charles, was born March 18, 1864. He came to the U.S. when he was about 16 years old and spent some time in Bridgeport, Conn.

At the time when the attention of the nation was directed to the Trans-Mississippi country and troubles with the various Indian tribes called for definite military action, Grandpa came to Fort Keigh, located at the mouth of the Tongue River. He was with the 22nd Infantry. He remained with them through the Souix uprising which was climaxed by the death of Sitting Bull and not long thereafter by the Wounded Knee battle. Grandpa, who was a tailor by trade, made the shroud in which Sitting Bull was buried. He is buried in a cemetery not far from Old Fort Yates. Following his discharge he returned to Miles City, Montana and had a tailor shop at N. 7th St. He retired in 1935. He passed away in Miles City on March 12, 1947.

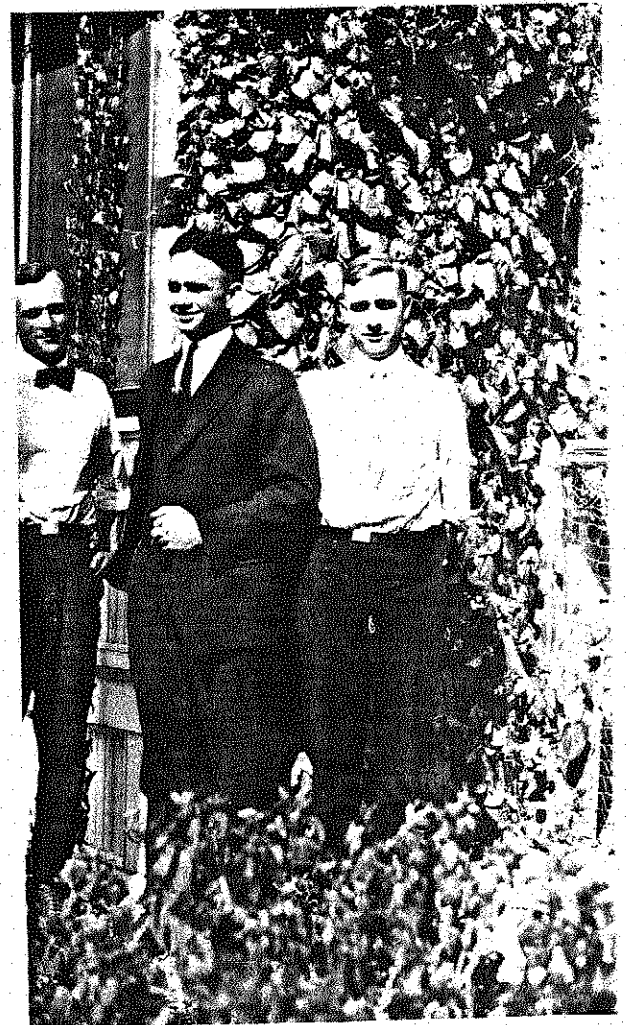

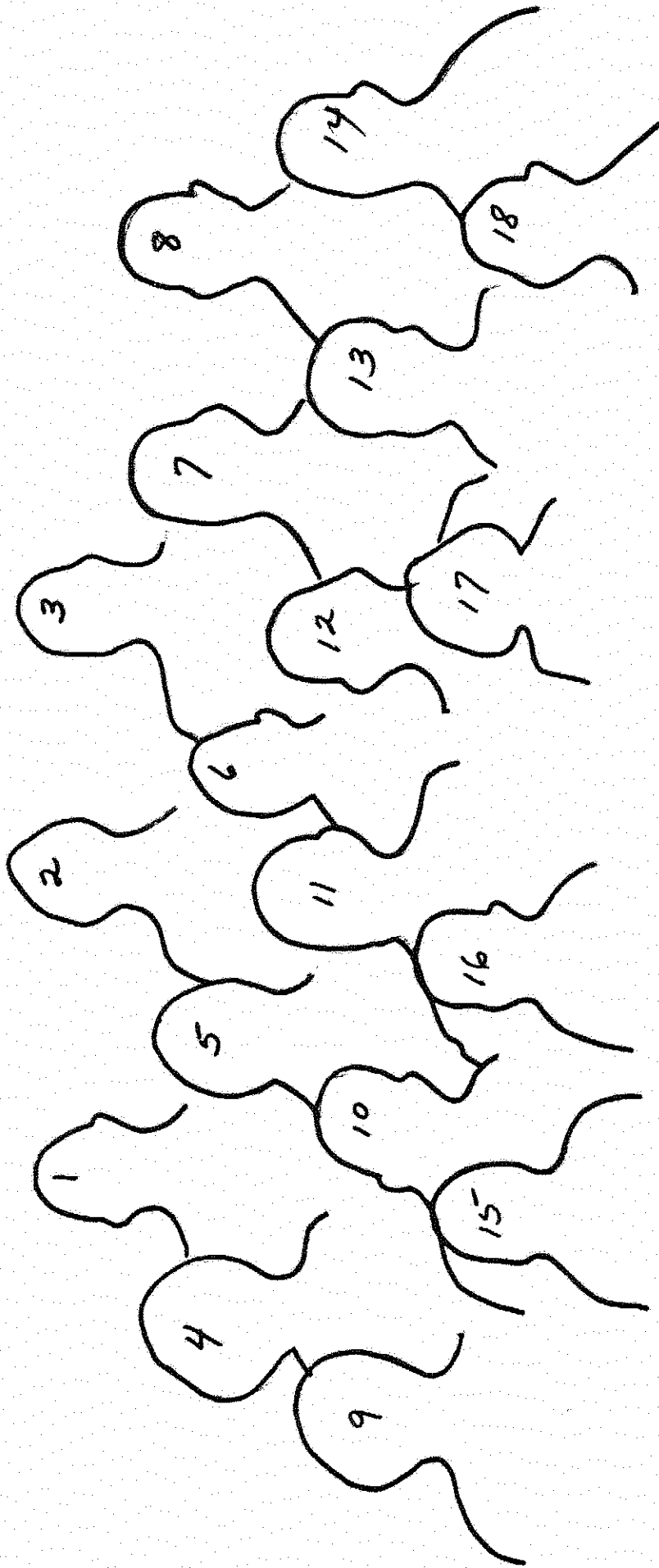

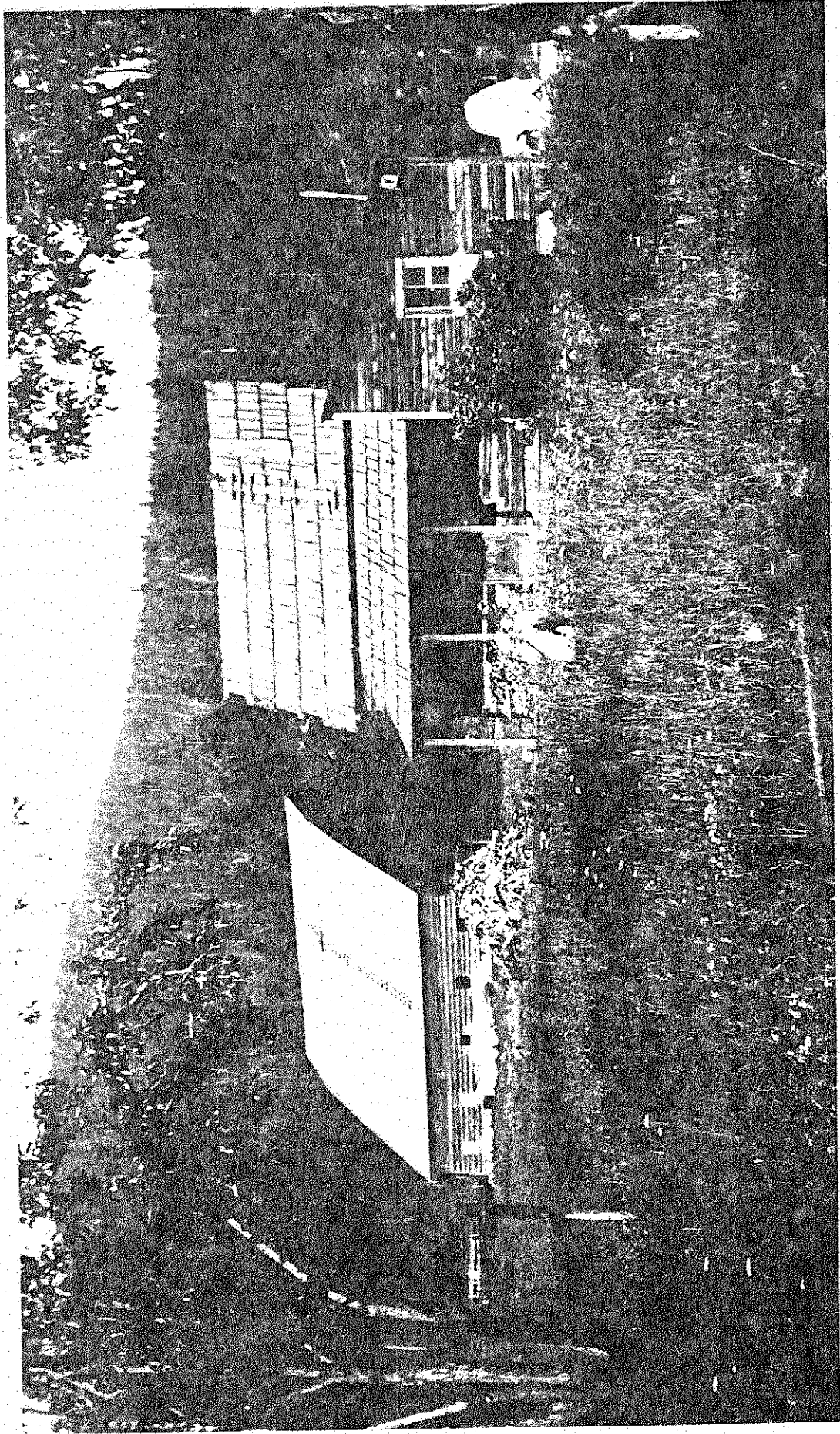
WALTER KAISER
